

will grow in popularity in the coming season," Gauri Shah, Co-founder & Principal Architect, FACILIS Architecture and Interior Design Studio, says. After the ornate chandeliers of 2018, 2019 will give way to sleeker and smarter lighting options. But if you thought that the trend of handmade, crafted dining tables, chairs and other dining room furniture pieces would go away, think again, as they are going to be back. Dining tables with natural edges and a raw finish will be one of the top choices next season, as would natural wooden cabinets and chairs. Do not hide beams and ceilings with paneling or paint. Instead use transparent lacquer to protect them but let them remain exposed.

"The future will see more built-in appliances in dining areas. Spaces will be allocated and carved out specially for flower arrangements and green plants, as more clients are realising the value of indoor green zones and their positive impact of our psychology and health," Shah says.
